Prayer for Illumination

Friends, one of the key parts of worship every week—no matter where we are or what the service looks like—is hearing and reading scripture. So today we are going to read our scripture passage three times, and as we do, we invite you to make note of the words and phrases that stand out to you. Before we read, let us pray:

Jesus, you asked questions as much as you answered them. You never shied away from conversation. You were always sparking curiosity, opening people's minds, and engaging in the art of connection with everyone around you. As we come to your Word and as we approach one another today, give us the same curiosity, openness, and connection.

We are here. We are listening. Amen.

Scripture Reading

As you hear God's Word, for the first time, underline the words or phrases that stand out to you.

As you hear our scripture read aloud, for the second time, circle the words or phrases that stand out to you.

You might find yourself circling new words, or some of the same words from our first reading.

As you hear our scripture read aloud one last time, write the words or phrases that most captivate you. Hold onto these phrases as a prayer.

John 15:9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
