Living into the Beatitudes

Mourn (The Way of Lament): I have moved from avoiding pain to facing pain. I am no longer afraid to feel the empty places in my life. When I am hurting, I share it with God and others. I can weep like Jesus.

Meek (The Way of Humility): I have come to a place where I don't have to compete or be the strong one all the time. My identity is no longer based on rivalry and comparison but on being the person God has created me to be.

Righteous/Justice (The Way of Justice): I have embraced my agency and power to do good even when I feel small and powerless in the face of the world's challenges. I do not throw my hands up in resignation but am working to co-create a better world with God.

Pure in Heart (The Way of Right Motive): I have come to a place where I can be open and honest with God and others- vulnerable and transparent because I have nothing to hide. I don't have to put on "airs" or pretend to be what I'm not.

Peacemaker (The Way of Peace): I have come to the place where I avoid creating a sense of safety and security by dividing the world into us and them. I see now there are no sides. We are all children of God.
