Our Stance in the World (Matthew 7)

- Do to others as you would have them do to you.
- Realize that aliveness includes tough choices, and that thriving includes suffering.
- Don't be misled by religious talk; what counts is living by Jesus's teaching.

Group Discussion (10 minutes)

- Adults ask kids: If you were ruler, what would your number one rule be, and why? I wonder why Jesus' number one rule was to be kind...
- Kids ask adults: Do you remember who taught you the golden rule and why?
- Why do think versions of the golden rule can be found in many cultures and religions?

Personal Identity (Matthew 5:1-16)

- Be among the lowly in spirit, remain sensitive to pain and loss, live in the
 power of gentleness, show mercy to everyone rather than harshness, don't hide
 hypocrisy or duplicity in your heart, work for peace, be willing to joyfully
 suffer persecutions insult for doing what is right.
- Dare to be a nonconformist by being boldly different, like salt and light in the world. Demonstrate your differentness through works of generosity and beauty.

Responsive Litany for the Way of Love (Matthew 5:21-48)

Never hate, hold grudges, or indulge in anger.

Instead, aim to be the first to reach out a hand in reconciliation.

Avoid exaggeration when making vows.

Instead, practice clear, straight speech, so words like yes and no retain their full value.

Reject revenge.

Instead, pursue creative and nonviolent ways to overcome wrongs done to you.

Love your enemies as well as your friends, and so imitate God's big, generous heart for all creation.

Inner Work (Matthew 6)

- Cultivate a hidden life of goodness by giving to the poor; praying, and fasting secretly.
- Don't let greed cloud your outlook on life, but store up true wealth by investing in a growing portfolio of generosity and kindness.
- Be especially vigilant about money dictating your life.
- Don't let anxiety run and ruin your life, but instead trust yourself to God's gracious and parental care, and seek first and foremost to build the just and generous society that would fulfill God's best dreams for humanity.
- Don't develop a sharp eye for the faults and failures of others, but instead first work on your own blindness to your own faults and failures.
- Go to God with all your needs, and don't be discouraged if you face long delays. Remember that God loves you as a faithful, caring parent will come through in due time

<u>Guest Preacher: Dan Day – November 20</u>

Leading up to our 200th anniversary, First Baptist is welcoming back their former pastors to the pulpit. On November 20, during both worship services, Dan Day will be preaching. Dan Day became pastor of FBC, Columbia in early 1985, coming from a pastorate in his native state of Oklahoma. He is a graduate of Oklahoma Baptist University and also earned graduate degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (M.Div. and Ph.D.) but spent most of his ministry years as a pastor of churches in Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Missouri, and North Carolina. Upon his retirement as pastor of the First Baptist Church of Raleigh, NC, he spent five years as a faculty member at Campbell University Divinity School in NC, teaching Preaching and Worship. Mary Carol, his wife, is from Alabama and in addition to being a mother for their twin sons, John and Doug, she taught in public schools, worked as a school counsellor and, during the Day's eleven years in Columbia, she earned two graduate degrees from the University of Missouri.
