Tuesday Evening Visio Divina Bible Study

Visio Divina, Latin for "divine seeing," is a method of meditation, reflection, and prayer through a process of intentional seeing. Visio Divina extends the 6th century Benedictine practice of Lectio Divina by the use of visual imagery. Traditionally, Visio Divina was accompanied by Benedictine iconography and illuminations, however, different faith traditions have adapted the process over time, utilizing both secular and non-secular images. During Lent, Pastor Brittany will be leading a Visio Divina Bible Study via Zoom at 7 pm. The meeting will be a blend of visual meditation with group discussion and bible study.

Stations of the Cross Experience- March 1-17

Stations of the Cross is an in-person experience, which will be set up in the Sanctuary open March 1-17. The experience honors the ancient story of Jesus' death while recognizing the ways this narrative repeats itself again and again throughout the past and present. It provides multi-sensory ways to engage, confess, and lament, creating a profound and prophetic worship experience. Designed by Rev. T. Denise Anderson, the service features her original artwork and artist statement, *Pietà: "Woman, Behold Your Son; Behold Your Mother*—a sermon project exploring the story of Mamie Till-Mobley (the mother of Emmett Till) and the grief of Mary, mother of Jesus, beholding her son on the cross. Special Zoom at Noon with Brian Kaylor

On Wednesday, March 24, Brain Kaylor will be our special guest for Zoom at Noon. Last August, Brian who is editor & president of Word&Way, associate director of Churchnet, and author of four books on religion, politics, and communication, joined us for a conversation about Christian Nationalism. As a reminder, Christian Nationalism is an ideology, which seeks to merge Christian and American identities and in doing so, distorts both the Christian faith and America's constitutional democracy. On January 6, when the assault on the capitol happened our conversation with Brian felt prophetic. Join us for Zoom at Noon as we discuss the assault on the Capitol and how it intersects with the disturbing movement known as Christian Nationalism.

<u>CBF Heartland Webinar - Advocating for Rural Community</u> <u>Development- Tuesday, March 23 at 3 pm</u>

On March 23 our First Baptist congregation is invited to join leaders from Together for Hope, CBF's rural development coalition, to discuss ways churches can help alleviate poverty in the Heartland.

Jason Coker, President of Together for Hope, and L. Nicole Stringfellow, Regional Vice President - Delta, will lead participants through engaging exercises and discussions. For 20 years, Together for Hope has helped to change thinking about poverty. First Baptist folks will know their work from our partnership with the Lakota reservation in Bridger, SD. Bridger was part of Together for Hope's initial focus in changing the lives of those in poverty in our country. As a result of their work, our church was able to join the partnership of CBF churches whose lives have been enriched by our relationship with the people of Bridger. Now, in the wake of the pandemic, Together for Hope's expertise is more vital for our churches than it has ever been.
