Rev. Dr. John S. Park is Director of the Doctor of Ministry Program at Central Baptist Theological Seminary. He is also the Des Peres Chair of Congregational Health and Faculty Representative to the Board of Directors. He has served in numerous churches as a youth pastor, college/young adults pastor, English Ministry pastor, assistant pastor, and taught adjunctively at Dallas Baptist University and Central Baptist Theological Seminary before joining Central Seminary as a standing faculty member. John has taught Leadership, Followership, Missional Churches, Asian Values vs. European Values, Cross-Cultural Ministry, Missional Church Leadership, Evangelism, Design Thinking, and Organizational Leadership in the U.S., South Korea, Guatemala, Myanmar, and Cuba. John has a Master of Divinity from the Asian Center for Theological Studies and Mission, a Master of Theology from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and a PhD in Leadership Studies from Dallas Baptist University. John lives in Overland Park, Kansas and is married to Su Mi Park and has one son, Moses, who is now in college.
