Christmas Parade- This Afternoon- November 27

199 Reasons to Give

Honest Advent

This year our theme is Honest Advent. The Honest Advent theme is based around the work of Scott Erickson, a painter, illustrator, and self-described “creative curate.” His 2020 book, *Honest Advent: Awakening to the Wonder of God-with-Us Then, Here, and Now*, features his artwork along with 25 daily devotionals for the season.

We invite you to come with an open mind and curiosity as we explore the themes of vulnerability, love, identity, embodiment, and participation. Devotionals will be available for purchase for \$15 beginning November 27. In addition, the art show, which accompanies the book, with its alternative symbols for the season, some of which are beautiful, others provocative and thought-provoking, will be on display in our worship spaces and hallway.

Through Erickson’s book, an art show, and worship services, we will ask, “is Christ’s incarnation still happening in our midst?”

The Hanging of the Green, which marks the beginning of Advent, is November 27 during both worship services.
