Worship Notes

Postlude: Good Christian Friends, Rejoice, arr. Gramann, Chancel Bells & Organ

The bell tree part featured in Good Christian Friends, Rejoice played by the Chancel Bells is meant to represent a "zimbelstern". Zimbelsterns are components of some organs that can be turned on by the organist. A Zimbelstern is a set of metal plates in a circular configuration with a small spinning mallet attached to a motor in the center of the plates. The organist sets the speed of the motor and then turns on the zimbelstern. The motor spins the mallet and it hits the metal plates, creating a constant repeated pattern or "ostinato" that plays throughout the piece. Today's piece is a transcription of a Bach organ arrangement of the popular German carol. The bell tree representing the zimbelstern helps to invoke the feel of an organ throughout the piece. Our "zimbelstern" today is none other than our own wonderful organist, Colleen Ostercamp!
